Teacher's Day Special



In many countries, "**Teacher's Day**" is intended to be special days for the appreciation of teachers, and may include celebrations to honour them for their special contributions in a particular field area, or the community in general. The date on which Teachers' day is celebrated varies from country to country. Teachers' days are distinct from World Teachers' Day which is officially celebrated across the world on October 5.

The idea of celebrating Teachers' Day took ground in many countries during the 20th century; in most cases, they celebrate a local educator or an important milestone in education (for example, Argentina has commemorated Domingo Faustino Sarmiento's death on September 11 since 1915, while India celebrates Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan's birthday on September 5 since 1962. This is the primary reason why countries celebrate this day on different dates, unlike many other International Days.

Raksha Bandhan Students were celebrating at Iact Habra centre

Raksha Bandhan is a Hindu festival that celebrates the love and duty between brothers and sisters; the festival is also popularly used to celebrate any brother-sister relationship between men and women. The festival is observed by Hindus, and Jains. Raksha Bandhan is primarily observed in India, Mauritius and major parts of Nepal. In the state of West Bengal and Odisha, this day is also called Jhulan Purnima. Prayers and puja of Lord Krishna and Radha are performed there.



Raksha Bandhan is an ancient festival, dating back six thousand years. It has many myths and historic legends linked to it. For example, the Rajput queens practised the custom of sending rakhi threads to neighbouring rulers as token of brotherhood. On Raksha Bandhan, sisters tie a rakhi on her brother's wrist. This symbolizes the sister's love and prayers for her brother's well-being, and the brother's lifelong vow to protect her.

He was speaking at the signing of the tripartite agreement between National Skill Development Fund (NSDF) and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Power Grid Corporation of India (PGCI) that will see PGCI contribute its CSR funds for national skill qualification framework aligned with skill development activities in the country.

FAQ's [Frequently Asked Questions]

1. What is the PMKVY scheme about?

The objective of this Scheme is to encourage skill development for youth by providing monetary rewards for successful completion of approved training programs. Specifically, the Scheme aims to:

Encourage standardization in the certification process and initiate a process of creating a registry of skills
Enable and mobilize a large number of Indian youth to take up skill training and become employable and earn their livelihood. Increase productivity of the existing workforce and align the training and certification to the needs of the country.

Provide Monetary Awards for Skill Certification to boost employability and productivity of youth by incentivizing them for skill trainings

Reward candidates undergoing skill training by authorized institutions at an average monetary reward of Rs. 8,000 (Rupees Eight Thousand) per candidate.

Benefit 24 lakh youth at an approximate total cost of Rs. 1,500 crores

2. What would be the entire process from enrolment to money transfer for a fully certified trainee?

Please find below the process divided into flowing steps:

Trainee to enroll at a training center with a training partner and select a course of his preference

Trainee to provide relevant information to the Training Partner who captures all the candidate details on SDMS to facilitate training

Undergo assessment at the training center

Receive certificate from the training partner upon successful completion of assessment

NSDC to disburse monetary reward to passed and certified trainees subject to valid Aadhaar authentication

3. How can a trainee enroll for a course?

The trainee can call the NSDC Call Centre number on +91 88000-55555 or check for the Training Center on the PMKVY website to find the nearest Training Center. Any eligible candidate can get registered with any of the approved Training Providers for the approved courses. Training Partner captures all the candidate details in the SDMS system and facilitates the training. District wise Kaushal Melas are also being organized by Training Partners for mobilization and enrollment. You may check the PMKVY website for more details.

4. What are the charges/fees for the course?

Trainee will need to pay for the training and assessment fees upfront to the Training Provider. The Training Partner can also provide credit to such candidates and waive off the course fee but still need to collect the Assessment fee. The Training Partner would then be paid from the monetary reward by the trainee after getting certified.

5. What is the eligibility criteria for the trainee to enroll for a course?

This scheme is available to any person of Indian nationality who:

Undergoes a skill development training in an eligible sector by an eligible training provider

Is certified during the span of one year from the date of launch of the scheme by approved assessment agencies;

Is availing this monetary award for the first and only time during the operation of this scheme
